

You don't have to own an old car to like old cars. And that's the way it is with our membership requirement. You simply have to like old cars!

The Treasure Coast Vintage Car Club (TCVCC), now in its 30th year, is a region of the Antique Automobile Club of America or AACA. (Technically we're the Treasure Coast Region of AACA).

We have over 100 family units giving us a membership of approximately 200 with interests ranging from pre-1900s vehicles to muscle cars of the '60s, '70s and early '80s. Our monthly meetings are typically held the fourth Sunday of each month; each in a different location. It might be a garage tour, an exclusive visit to a private collection, a poker run, a picnic at a special location—you name it, but always interesting and family fun oriented.

Our award-winning monthly newsletter, *Vintage Times*, is an informative recap of events, member news and activities with our club and other auto-related clubs of interest. The club's website, www.tcvcc.com includes a full color version of the newsletter as well as other timely information.

Some of the regular events we host in addition to monthly meetings include:

FALL FESTIVAL ANTIQUE AUTO EVENT—Each October we draw hundreds of participants to the Treasure Coast for this Friday-Saturday-Sunday event highlighted by a true antique auto show all day Saturday. The event is free to spectators and typically draws thousands to a local venue.

NAPLES DEPOT TOUR—Over the years we have established a “sister chapter” relationship with our friends in the Naples/Marco Island Region who stage an annual March show at the old Naples Depot Park. This Friday-Saturday-Sunday tour is highlighted by the Saturday show which is always well attended.



CRACKER TOUR—Each Spring we tune 'em up for a 400-500 mile 4 to 5 day tour on the back roads of Florida, visiting many places seasoned Floridians may know and seasonal Floridians are just discovering. Our leisurely 50mph pace is the ideal speed to really see and appreciate Florida's diverse countryside and rural town sights. Complaints are few as the rule of thumb is “when stuff happens, the fun begins!”

Then we wrap up the long hot summer with the tour that has come to be known as the “I don't care” tour:

HOT AUGUST NIGHTS—Actually, it could be August or

September. We don't care! It's always a fun getaway to destinations usually unknown until the last minute. Despite the mystery—and maybe because of it—we usually have 20 or more vehicles participate.

To join TCVCC you must also join AACA and that has its own benefits, including a full color quarterly magazine, *Antique Automobile*, an extensive research library available to members, a beautiful new automotive museum and regional judging shows throughout the year, including the legendary Hershey Fall Meet in Hershey, PA. With a membership of over 62,000 in 400-plus regions throughout the world, AACA is perhaps the largest and most international of all vintage vehicle associations. Recognized vehicles include autos, trucks, certain vintage hot rods, race cars, muscle cars and motorcycles/scooters into the early '80s.

DUES BILLED ANNUALLY

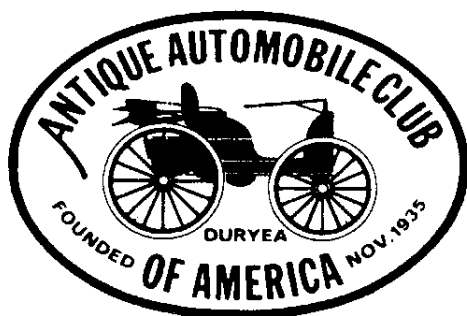
Dues are billed annually only. Memberships processed in November will include the following year. There is no prorating of dues and back issues of Antique Automobile may not always be available.

THE CLUB

The Antique Automobile Club of America is the country's oldest and largest automotive historical society. A Pennsylvania nonprofit corporation, it is dedicated to the preservation, restoration and maintenance of automobiles and automotive history. Founded in Philadelphia in 1935, its membership has grown to over 60,000 members from all parts of the world. The AACA holds country-wide competitive and noncompetitive meets and events. These are on a divisional basis offering a program within the reach of everyone. Tours and activities relating to the hobby are sponsored, including the AAA Revival Glidden Tour®, Founders Tour, Nickel Tour, Reliability Tour, Sentimental Tour and Divisional Tours. The annual meeting features seminars, trade show and a year end culminating awards banquet.

The AACA is proud of its relationship with the many historical organizations devoted to similar objectives the world over. The Club, through its national office, publications, and membership, aids individuals, museums, libraries, historians and collectors dedicated to the preservation of automotive history.

VEHICLES

Motor vehicles of all types, 25 years old and older are grouped for competitive purposes into many classes according to age and mechanical features. AACA has a comprehensive judging system that allows members to earn significant awards for their vehicles. AACA also recognizes original cars, Historic Preservation of Original Features (HPOF) and unmodified 25 year and older vehicles that are driven, Drivers Participation (DPC) and have not obtained a First Junior award within our judging system. The club recognizes classes of motorcycles and documented race cars as well. Further details can be found in our judging manual which is available online at www.aaca.org.

AACA MUSEUM

Your dues automatically include membership in the AACA Museum in Hershey, PA. Your current year membership card entitles you to free admission and if you hold a joint membership, your spouse as well. The AACA Museum was incorporated in 1993 and was completed in 2003 after a massive fund raising campaign. The facility encompasses 71,000 square feet and houses approximately 100 collector vehicles. REGIONS AND CHAPTERS

There are approximately 400 hundred regions and chapters chartered by the Antique Automobile Club of America in the United States and Canada. AACA LIBRARY & RESEARCH CENTER

Your dues automatically include membership in AACA's Library & Research Center. Incorporated in 1981, the Center provides historical research concerning the origins of and the development of motorized vehicles of all types. The center will assist hobbyist in the restoration and preservation of their antique vehicles. The Center employs a full-time staff to better serve the membership. Photocopying (including color) services are available through the Research Center at nominal fees. Members qualify for limited free research. Further benefits are also available.
